A BRIEF HISTORY...


Hartlepool United Football Club was formed as a professional club in 1908 from a successful Amateur Cup-winning team, and joined the League in 1921.


Through two minor name changes, Hartlepool United have spent all of their years in the lower two divisions of the Football League, but nonetheless have a fascinating if somewhat chequered history.

"I'm Gavin Coleman, assistant coach for HUWFC U23's.Our manager is Paul Jeffries, and we are currently looking for another coach to join our team. Our home venue is at Greatham Sports field off Station Road in Greatham. Our match kick-off times are 2pm Sundays and all support is welcome.

We currently train at East
Durham College in Peterlee and
our winter training will be at
West Hartlepool Rugby Club.
We would like to thank the
residents of Greatham for their
support towards the team. We
have developed a partnership
with the village community
groups where we support each
other and are making the game
inclusive for all ages as well as
improving community
integration, health and
well-being.

We are having our first season in the women's football leagues, playing in the Durham County FA League One.

Last season we were unbeaten and won the Russell Foster Youth League U18 Southern Division. Following this we felt that now was a great time to take the step up into the women's leagues even though we have a very young team. Paul Jeffries has managed the team since 2016 and the team has had a lot of success and developed a very attractive style of play. What is great is that there is still some of



the girls who originally started at that time still part of the club. I have been assisting with the team for just over a year. I was the typical dad on the sidelines who just wanted to help and when the previous coach stepped up to be the women's manager, Paul needed some support to keep the team going. I was happy to help and a few months later I had my badges as was ready to go. We all just love

the game, and we want to create a positive environment where the girls, their families and our supporters can come and enjoy themselves.

It's been great to see the women's game take off and the success of the Lionesses which is an inspiration to all young footballers. The national game does need to produce a more evenly distributed financial model which find its way

to the lower tiers. It is a constant battle provide basic facilities with limited resources and will continue to be heavily reliant on sponsors, volunteers and goodwill.

We are appreciative as a team that we have great backing from our sponsors (opportunities still available), community groups, families, and supporters and if we didn't have their backing the team would struggle. Increased integration between men's and women's teams including community initiatives would be great to continue this development. The women's game is becoming more commercially lucrative in the higher tiers. It would be good if professional men's clubs, especially those in lower leagues, saw this as mid to long term opportunity to invest in their women's squads and create a club model which would be to the benefit of both their men's and women's teams.

There are now four to five women's teams in the town which is incredible and it's going to create lots of opportunities for girls to progress in the game.

But we do need better facilities and for stakeholders to work together to grasp the opportunity. I think most people would agree the town has missed opportunities over the years to put itself on the map and it would be a shame if in 5 or 10-years' time the town hasn't progressed a womens team further up the football tiers due to resources because the talent is there. Her Game Too is a brilliant concept, and you can see the tangible impact it has had on the women's game across the town and country. A great example is the backing it gave to an event we had in Greatham a couple of weeks ago. We held a walking football match between female residents of the village and some of the U23's team. The age range of the players at the event were between 16 and 95. including 4 generations from the same family, which might be a record! As a team we believe in social value and the positive social impact a football team can have in the community. We would love to do more events in the community and to show

that it's a two-way relationship and not just about people investing in the team but the team investing in the community. The Her Game Too campaign not only gives these events a focal point but is now a platform for promotion and publicity as it's a recognised brand. It also a way for women within the game to share their stories and to demonstrate there is exciting opportunities within football for women and for girls to aspire to."

Many thanks to Gavin for giving us insight into the HUWFC U23's team.It's great to hear how the team are really working within the community as they grow and develop their support base and home ground in Greatham. Partnerships are about working together for the benefit of not just the partners but the whole community. We hope our partnerships with HUFC, HUCSF, grassroots clubs, supporter's groups, local businesses and education providers will result in improved community relations for everyone across the town and wider area. Formed 136 years ago, Woking registered their highest ever league finish last season as Darren Sarll quided them to the National League play-off places. The Cardinals have played at the Laithwaite Community Stadium since 1922, based in Surrey and holding a capacity of 6,000. Sarll's outfit currently sit eighth in the table with three wins, three draws and two defeats.

They're unbeaten in four, having wins against Gateshead and Dorking. alongside draws with Maidenhead and Solihull Moors. Last time out. Pádraig Amond scored in the second half to rescue a point in a one-all home draw. They've added to their ranks during the week with the loan signing of ex-Poolie, Timi Odusina, from Bradford City.

Sarll is currently in his third managerial job, having also managed Stevenage and Yeovil Town. The 40-year-old also enjoyed a spell as Watford's Head of Academy in 2018. His playing days were spent in the non-league system, with the midfielder appearing for Bedford, Hitchin and Hemel Hempstead Town. Retiring in 2006, Sarll began coaching in the youth systems of Stevenage, Brentford and Rotherham United. His break into senior management came after Teddy Sheringham's departure from Boro in 2015.

Flash forward eight years and Sarll has entered his next challenge with Woking, where he reached play-off football last season.



WOMEN'S UPDATE

Hartlepool United Women got off to a frustrating start to their 2023/24 season, losing 5-3 to Spennymoor Town in a pulsating affair at Grayfields.

Despite twice going ahead, a tough last half hour cost Pools the points.

A repeat of last year's opening fixture and a game between two recently promoted sides, the tie was always set up to provide entertainment and both teams went at it right from the first whistle. Spennymoor had the first shot of the game through Caitlin Bates but Pools keeper Lauren Ranson was equal to it.

The breakthrough came in the 25th minute. Some strong midfield play between Anya Geary and Lauren Gray played in Steph Bilcliff and the Pools forward slid the ball under the onrushing goalkeeper to make it 1-0.

The visitors turned the game on its head through two set pieces. Ranson had done well to deny Bates's 25 yard piledriver from finding the top corner but from the resulting corner, Bates whipped a delivery towards the back post that went all the way in.

Spennymoor took the lead in the 37th minute. Bates again swung another delivery in which was guided in by Alice Welch-Davison.

Pools weren't downhearted for long and were level within three minutes. A quickly taken throw-in from Bilcliff played in Geary and set up Foster to slide home the equaliser.

After the break, Pools picked up where they had left off and went ahead in the 53rd minute. 

We rotated the squad last weekend but we've got a few more knocks so it may be another chance for the other lads to impress and show us what they can do."


Despite last week's cup defeat, Pools remain undefeated in league action with two wins and a draw.
